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# The Marrara Family

## The Diagnosis

Tiffany Marrara was 10 weeks pregnant with twins when she received a call from her doctor asking if her husband, Nicholas, had ever had a blood screening for Kell antigens. While some blood antigens will only deplete blood cell counts, Kell antigens travel into bone marrow and impact blood cell production at its source. The doctor told Tiffany that Kell antigens were found in her bloodwork and if they were also present in Nicholas' screening, their babies would be at risk for developing anemia and possible heart failure.

A few weeks later, the twins were showing symptoms of anemia. Tiffany's pregnancy suddenly became very complex. She was carrying two babies who had a rare

blood condition, and one of them was positioned in such a way that intervention would be very difficult. Tiffany's doctors were very concerned about the babies' situation as they would need to undergo transfusions while in utero.

Tiffany and the twins underwent their first transfusion at 22 weeks with great success. Doctors planned to transfuse every two to three weeks until the babies were strong enough to be delivered.

At 27 weeks, one of the twins, Luke, began to develop complications that made transfusions difficult. At 28 weeks, Tiffany and Nicholas were told that they would need to make a choice if their next transfusion failed – if they did not deliver the babies prematurely via an emergency c-section, Luke would likely pass away due to fetal heart failure from anemia.



Luke soon underwent an external blood transfer, where all of the blood in his body was replaced with twice as much new blood in order to clear out the antigens. After 48 hours, Luke and Maddie were doing well and impressing their care teams.

To Tiffany and Nicholas, there was no question as to what to do. Luke and his sister, Maddie, were born at only 28 weeks gestation.

#### The Dilemma

With the twins delivered and expected to be in the hospital for some months to come, the Marraras needed to figure out their next steps. Their commute to the hospital was over an hour in each direction. They also had three older children to care for and a feeling of familiarity and comfort at home. They were unsure about what to do.

"After the first week of commuting, we realized we needed at least one of us to be closer," Tiffany said.

Our McFamily proudly supports all our special events by providing sponsorship dollars, attending, and volunteering to help ensure the events run smoothly and are a huge success. They bring warm smiles, interact with our guests, and help us raise as much money possible through raffles and contests held on site.

Each McFamily member is an ambassador for RMHC CTMA in their own way. Whether it is working behind the scenes to introduce and connect us to their business partners, lending support and insight to ensure fundraising campaigns are a success, or asking customers to Round-Up for RMHC when they take an order, everyone is dedicated to the same idea - giving care and support to the children that rely on RMHC CTMA to provide a home where they can be with their family while receiving the medical care they need.

## **Round-Up for RMHC!**

Round-Up for RMHC is an easy and impactful way to help the families that call our Ronald McDonald Houses their home! By visiting your local McDonald's and agreeing to increase the total of your bill up to the nearest dollar, your donated small change can make a big impact.

## Did you know?

The average Round-Up transaction in CT & Western MA is \$0.42! However, when multiplied several times a day across all the McDonald's restaurants in our area, these funds equate to over 385 nights of care, comfort, and kindness provided to families annually.

#### How does it work?

It's easy! When you visit your local McDonald's and place your order, you will be asked to Round-Up for RMHC. All you have to do is say YES and your bill will be increase to the nearest dollar. The increased amount is given to RMHC to provide meals, daily necessities, and all the compassionate support our families require.

Whether you order at the drive thru or front counter, the process is simple: Your order taker will ask you if you wish to Round-Up for RMHC before completing your food request. You reply "Yes, please!" If they do not ask at this time, you can say "I'd like to Round-Up for RMHC today!

At the lobby kiosks, once you choose your items and go to the check out screen, you will be asked if you would like to Round-Up for RMHC. Just push the button to agree.

### Why it matters

Every child deserves to receive the medical care they require no matter how far from their home it may be. Children also need to have their parents by their side during this intense and overwhelming process. Round-Up for RMHC is a small yet powerful way you can ensure that children have their families right by their sides as they face their medical battles head on.

Every time you Round-Up for RMHC, you will donate anywhere from \$0.01 - \$0.99. Knowing that small amount is making sure BIG things happen is priceless.
