Rio, the Little Fighter

Cristian and Tessa spent three long years undergoing IVF treatments in the hopes of having a baby. After suffering two miscarriages, they were finally able to conceive their son, Rio – their "little fighter."

Around 20 weeks of pregnancy, Tessa began to experience complications with her blood pressure and blood sugar. She also learned that her placenta was not delivering necessary nutrients to Rio, meaning that her baby was experiencing growth restriction.

Tessa was admitted to the hospital and started to undergo a round of steroid treatment to try to help Rio's lungs develop in case he needed to be delivered early. When she began to experience pre-eclampsia, Tessa and Cristian were left with no choice but to deliver Rio prematurely.

At 25 weeks and three days of pregnancy, Rio was born. He weighed just 13 ounces and was only 10 inches long. Tessa and Cristian were scared and uncertain of what the future held for them and their baby.

Rio was admitted to the NICU as soon as he was born. Tessa and Cristian had not planned to have their baby in New Haven, and home

was well over an hour away. They began to panic at the idea that they would return home without their son while he continued to undergo treatment so far away. That is when they learned about Ronald McDonald House – a place that would allow them to stay just across the street from the hospital so they could be with Rio at a moment's notice.

We would not have been able to be as present, our stress and anxiety levels would have been through the roof, and we would have been exhausted.

Rebuild, Restore, Renew - RMH of Springfield

Ronald McDonald House of Springfield was built over 32 years ago, and has since been home to over 12,000 families. After all the years of providing a warm, safe, and comforting environment, the wear and tear on the exterior of the building had caused severe deterioration of the siding, gutters, and windows, to the point of needing full replacement. By addressing these repairs quickly, we safeguarded the guest rooms against possible damage from any additional exterior deterioration, ensuring no families would be turned away.

The Beaulieau Construction Company stepped up to the challenge and worked diligently to preserve the integrity of the House, beautify and reinforce our outer appearance, and were as unintrusive as possible to the families in our care. Throughout the process, RMH families continued to use our services while staying in upgraded rooms as we completed the multi-month endeavor.

The outdoor space in the backyard still requires renovation as the deterioration of the old playground needed removal this past fall. Our plan is to create an inviting space that includes a children's play area, a family activity section, and a pergola to provide shade to families enjoying fresh air and sunshine.

Trader Joe's

Trader Joe's has been helping feed RMHCT families for over seven years. Through their Neighborhood Shares Program, fresh fruit, vegetables, and signature treats of cookies, mini cakes, flowers, and snacks are donated weekly. Trader Joe's support ensures a consistent staple of fresh and pantry items for every family to enjoy.

Thanks to special RMH volunteers, like Mary and Bruce, the donations are picked up and delivered to the House. Our staff and volunteers sort and stock all items in the kitchen for family use, as well as arrange the flowers to add color and happiness to our dining tables.

Rachel's Table

Rachel's Table, a program of the Jewish Federation of Western Massachusetts, has been working to alleviate hunger and reduce food waste in the Springfield community and surrounding areas for many years. The Rachel's Table volunteers collect food from area supermarkets, caterers, restaurants and bakeries, and—with big smiles—deliver it to local non-profits and organizations.

RMH Springfield is one of the organizations they support, and we are appreciative of their kindness. Two days a week, a delivery is made. No two weeks are ever the same. Sometimes, its frozen ready to make lunch or dinner foods, or bagels, ice cream, veggies, chicken nuggets and french fries. At other times the delivery is fresh sandwiches, snacks, pastries or bakery items such as pumpkin and banana bread slices, vanilla scones, cookies and even cake pops. This food

delivery is carefully sorted and placed in the shared fridge and freezers by House volunteers, for families to access as needed and desired.

These types of food deliveries allow RMH families to worry less about what's for lunch or dinner and enjoy wholesome nutritious comfort food. This ensures they are focusing all their energy on their child's essential medical needs.
